Cultural capital

- Cultural capital is the essential knowledge that children need to be **educated citizens (school)**.
- Cultural capital is the essential knowledge that children need to **prepare them for future success (early years)**.



The curriculum is used to create and enhance the experiences and opportunities available to children, particularly the most disadvantaged.

Some children arrive at an early year's settings with poorer experiences than others, in their learning and play. What a setting does, through its curriculum and interactions with practitioners, potentially makes all the difference for children.

It is the role of the setting to ensure that children experience the awe and wonder of the world in which they live, through the seven areas of learning.
